

Ria Acciani - MPT, CCRP, IADN cert. Co-Owner, Advanced Canine Rehabilitation Center, Warren, New Jersey, US

Ria Acciani received her Masters in Physical Therapy degree from University of St.Augustine, Florida. She has over 25 years of experience in both human and Canine Physical Therapy. She received her CCRP from UTN and was the first Physical Therapist, along with her husband, in New Jersey to practice on dogs. Ria owns and operates the Advanced Canine Rehabilitation Center, a practice that focuses on orthopedic and sports rehabilitation and specializes in performance and sporting dogs. She travels extensively to national and international dog competitions and works with top level competitors. She is the OLicial Therapist for the AKC US

World Team, IFCS US Agility Team, WAO US Agility Team, and has travelled with these teams since 2010. Ria conducts instructional seminars on a variety of topics for dog handlers and educates them on how to prevent injury and enhance performance within their sport. Ria worked closely with Dr. Sherman Canapp and VOSM to establish the rehabilitation protocol for various shoulder elbow and pelvic limb conditions. She has published works in Veterinary Surgery, Veterinary Clinics of North America, and articles in Clean Run. She has presented at STAAR (since 2010), IAVRPT, ARSIG/APTA, and SCIVAC. She is a former Board Member for ARSIG/APTA and a member of AARV. When not working Ria is active with swimming, pilates and yoga. She loves to spend time with her 3 Border Collies, hiking and playing. Ria and David have 3 children, 2 in college and a junior in high school, and all 3 are very active in sports.

Kara Amstutz - DVM, DACVSMR, CVA, CVPP, CCRT CEO, Canine Rehab Institute, Springfield, Missouri, US

Dr. Kara Amstutz is presenting on behalf of the Canine Rehab Institute (CRI) and in cooperation with STAAR Conference. Dr. Kara Amstutz was born and raised in Springfield, Missouri. After completing a Biology degree at Missouri State University, she earned her Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine from the University of Missouri in 2000. She started Hometown Veterinary Hospital in 2002, growing quickly over the following years. In 2013, Dr. Amstutz became a Certified Canine Rehabilitation Therapist through Canine Rehabilitation Institute. The following year, Dr. Amstutz became a Certified Veterinary Pain Practitioner through the International Veterinary Academy of Pain Management. Then, in 2019 she became a Certified



Veterinary Acupuncturist through the International Veterinary Acupuncture Society. These advanced certifications allowed Dr. Amstutz to found River Canine Rehabilitation and transition her daily practice to rehabilitation and pain management cases only. In 2022, Dr. Amstutz became the new owner and CEO of Canine Rehabilitation Institute (CRI), a postgraduate rehabilitation and acupuncture certification program for veterinarians, physical therapists, and veterinary nurses. Dr. Amstutz is a lead instructor for multiple courses offered through CRI. Dr. Amstutz is also the CEO of Canine Arthritis Resources and Education (CARE), an online platform for veterinary health professionals and pet owners that helps care for dogs with osteoarthritis. Dr. Amstutz became a Diplomate of The American College of Veterinary Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation in 2023. Dr. Amstutz lectures nationally and internationally about osteoarthritis, the business of canine rehabilitation, and rehabilitation therapy. Looking into the future, Dr. Amstutz will continue her education and veterinary practice efforts focusing on sports medicine, pain management, and mobility. She loves to travel with her husband and four children in her free time.



I'd like to share a tribute to an incredible dog who truly embodied the spirit of STAAR — my companion, Jet, a Border Collie/Australian Shepherd mix. Many STAAR participants, staff, presenters, and exhibitors will remember Jet as he strutted through the halls and conference rooms each year at STAAR. He believed STAAR was his domain, and it seemed his mission was to help others learn about rehabilitation.

While many thought Jet was my dog, in reality, he was only mine for one week a year during the STAAR conference and every Wednesday at my clinic. His true owner, Rebecca Umberger, brought Jet into my life in July of 2013. At the time, I had just completed my CCRT and gave a presentation on physical rehabilitation to a local agility group, where Rebecca was in attendance. She brought Jet to my clinic for an evaluation and shared his story. Jet had been a typical, active puppy until around 4 months of age, when he suddenly started experiencing significant pain and difficulty moving. After numerous tests, including radiographs, MRI, and spinal and joint taps at both VT and UNC veterinary hospitals, no clear diagnosis emerged. Despite treatments with doxycycline, prednisone, and NSAIDs, Jet's pain persisted, and Rebecca hoped physical rehabilitation could offer a solution.

I'll never forget my first meeting with Jet. He appeared like an elephant balancing on a ball — so much pain that he growled when I entered the room. Yet, from the moment I met him, Jet trusted me. He allowed me to use my newly acquired skills to evaluate and treat him. Even as a beginner, I was able to offer him some relief, which fueled my determination to learn more and help him improve. I reached out to Thera-Paw for advice on bracing, and Ilaria not only called back but also encouraged me to attend the STAAR conference. With Rebecca's kind permission, I took 11-month-old Jet on his first road trip to New Jersey.

From 2013 onward, Jet and I made the journey from Roanoke, VA, to New Jersey every year. We attended every class we could — neuro courses, manual therapy, splinting, exercise, myofascial therapy, craniosacral therapy, neurodynamics, and more. Jet happily allowed me and other STAAR participants to practice what we learned. He greeted everyone with enthusiasm, never once complaining. Every year at STAAR, I gained knowledge, confidence, and the support to continue refining my rehabilitation practice, helping both Jet and my other patients.

While Jet may not have been "fixed," thanks to the friendships and knowledge gained at STAAR, he lived a full, active life

as an agility and farm dog. Despite his physical challenges, Jet became a beloved member of the agility community. With the support of Rebecca and myself, he competed in lower-level agility with his hock braces, reminding me of "Special Olympic" athletes — joyfully competing at his level with more enthusiasm than any other participant. Judges and competitors alike cheered him on through every course, captivated by his spirit. Though Jet retired from competition after a few years, he continued to travel with his housemates to trials.

Jet was able to attend STAAR's return in October 2023, enjoying a walk on the beach at the Jersey Shore. Unfortunately, in January 2025, Jet was put to sleep due to an unknown neurological condition that was unresponsive to treatment. There will be an empty spot at STAAR this year, and Jet will be greatly missed.

May we all carry the memory and spirit of Jet — and other dogs like him — who bravely and humbly push through challenges to become more than anyone ever expected. May Jet, along with all the animal volunteers, inspire us to appreciate the value of rehabilitation and the learning and friendships that STAAR fosters.


Leslie Eide - DVM, CCRT

With a solid foundation in human PT, she has adapted her skills (including her expertise in the Mulligan Technique) to her work with animals. Dr. Torraca is a pioneer in the field of canine physical rehabilitation and is a core faculty member of the NC State Veterinary School's Certified Companion Animal Therapy (CCAT) program. She also founded and heads the Certified Canine Manual Therapy (CCMT) program at UTN. Following her doctorate in Physical Therapy from UTN-Chattanooga, she transitioned to her work with animals and has been practicing canine rehabilitation for more

than 25 years. Dr. Torraca has authored many chapters in veterinary textbooks and writes for professional journals and magazines dedicated to the dog enthusiast. She has been a speaker and instructor at many veterinary conferences including the International Association of Veterinary Rehabilitation and Physical Therapy (IAVRPT), American College of Veterinary Surgeons (ACVS), North American Veterinary Conference (NAVC), Atlantic Coast Veterinary Conference (ACVC), and Western States Veterinary Conference (WSVC). She sits on the advisory board for Companion Animal Health and has been a key speaker at the American International Medical Laser Association. She is also a member of the International Veterinary Academy of Pain Management (IVAPM). 



More than Medicine: The Profound Rewards of Global Veterinary Outreach

It's a long journey to Todos Santos, Guatemala. This remote Mayan village tucked in the Western Highlands is a full day's worth of travel on winding roads from the capital of Guatemala City. But once you arrive, you're filled with a whole new energy. During my first trip to Todos Santos in 2018, I quickly learned that in this vibrant community, access to veterinary care had previously been almost nonexistent, and preventable diseases, parasites, and injuries in dogs and cats mostly went untreated. Thanks to the work of The Global Alliance for Animals and People (The GAAP) and support from Veterinarians International (VI), this reality has shifted and I have had the honor of being a small part of that story.

I traveled to Todos Santos as part of VI GIVES, Veterinarians International's immersive travel program for veterinary professionals, vet students, and anyone passionate about animals. VI GIVES offers journeys of discovery to serve local communities, learn about and promote conservation efforts, and take part in well-being and self care activities. In Todos Santos, alongside an incredible team of veterinarians, licensed vet technicians, and local caregivers, I spent several days providing essential medical care for the community's animals — conducting physical exams, administering vaccinations, treating illnesses, and performing spay/neuter surgeries.

One moment that stuck with me was meeting a woman who had walked for miles down the mountainside, carrying her cat in a bag so she could access the vet care provided at our clinic. She was deeply concerned about the cat's health, and though she had little money to give, she offered what she had as payment—just to make sure her cat would be cared for. Her love and dedication were palpable. It was at that moment that I was reminded of the true purpose of our work. Veterinary medicine isn't just about science and treatment; it's about compassion, connection, and ensuring that every animal, no matter where they are, has a chance at a healthier life.





The rewards of volunteering my time and talent have been far greater than I ever imagined. This experience has changed my perspective—not only on global veterinary medicine but also on the responsibility we have as professionals to extend our reach beyond our own communities. There are countless veterinarians and specialists in well-resourced countries with the knowledge and ability to make an impact, and I encourage my colleagues to step into this work.

It's for these two reasons - for the powerful collective impact we can create and for the feeling of purpose and passion it can reignite - that I invite you to consider participating in an immersive travel experience through VI GIVES. It's an opportunity to step outside the familiar, to get a firsthand look at the reality of veterinary care in places with extremely limited resources, to help where you can, and to come back with a renewed sense of purpose. And if travel isn't in your plans for this year, supporting Vets International through a donation is another meaningful way to contribute.
